# Junior League of Eau Claire Increases Children's Access To Dental Care

This year the Junior League of Eau Claire once again participated in the Sealants Today for Smiles Tomorrow Programs. Words cannot express how deeply we appreciate the volunteers and funding for these programs. Activities are underway in the form of grant writing to ensure sustainability. We just found out that we received an Anne Marie Foundation grant for \$2,000 for next year's sealant program!

During the 2006-2007 school year, 732 children and received oral health education in conjunction with information for children and parents about the importance of dental sealants. 253 or 35% of all of the second graders qualified (free and reduced lunch statistics) for the dental sealant program with 220 (87%) participating. Of those 220 screened, 188 (85%) received dental sealants with an average 3 dental sealants per child. 101 (46%) of the children screened had untreated dental decay with 39 (18%) needing urgent care. Each child with untreated dental decay averaged at least two teeth with dental decay – 74% being primary dentition. Of the 101 children identified as needing treatment, 48 or 48% received treatment to date.

Also, during this past school year, we screened 137 Head Start Children and placed 318 fluoride varnish treatments. Of the 137 children screened, 38 needed further treatment. Of those 38, only 8 have not completed treatment. Parents of Head Start children also received oral health education during parenting events.

As you can readily see, these preventive oral health programs continue to be important for preventing disease and finding a dental home for further dental treatment. Without these programs, many of these children would not have been identified as having unmet dental disease. Thanks again JLEC!!
