The smiles and excitement of the children were a fabulous reward for all of those who volunteered. One Eau Claire high school junior girl actually cried upon receiving her backpack because it was the FIRST backpack she has ever owned. She is one bright talented young lady who is extremely appreciative, she now knows someone does believe in her!

In this our 13th year of giving a successful school start to many children, we are indeed grateful to the many faithful Junior League volunteers. THANK YOU!! We filled the backpacks in record time 9:00 a.m - 12:45 p.m.. WOW--there were lots of busy hands counting and sorting the wonderful backpacks. A huge thank you to our most incredible loyal Phyllis Mattson who called to set up the volunteers. Every year, she does an outstanding job; the success of having the volunteers organized is due to her calls. Please thank her when you see her.



This year, we were able to purchase \$30 backpacks for \$5.77. Many school supplies went up in cost; however, we were able to find some good pricing through Boys & Girls Club special affiliates. The school district also helped us out with finding their best prices and passing those on to us.

We look forward to year 14 next year. It will be our final year in partnering with the Boys & Girls Club before they take over the reins completely in 2010. They will always need our League help in filling the backpacks. Those League members with their heart and soul into this program will always be welcomed with open arms.

Dental Sealants

On behalf of Healthy Communities: Eau Claire, thank you to those who participated during the 2007-2008 school year. For those who have not had an opportunity to be a part of this program, there are many chances for you to volunteer this year.

Eau Claire County statistics indicate that 10% of children are living in poverty. These children have very limited access to dental care. In partnership with Healthy Smiles for Wisconsin: Seal a Smile Initiative, the City-County Health Department, the Eau Claire Regional Dental Hygienists' Association, Junior League of Eau Claire, and Sacred Heart Hospital, dental sealants were placed on qualifying second graders in Eau Claire County.

During the 2007-2008 school year:

- 14 schools were visited.
- 824 children received oral health education along with information for children and parents about the importance of dental sealants.
- 311 (38%) second graders qualified (using free and reduced lunch statistics) for the dental sealant program with 234 (75%) participating.
- Of the 234 screened, 210 (90%) received dental sealants with an average of 3 dental sealants per child.
- 77 (34%) children screened had untreated dental decay with 25 (11%) needing urgent care.
- Each child with untreated dental decay averaged at least two teeth with dental decay.
- Of the 77 children identified as needing treatment, 28 (36%) have received treatment to date.

The goal for this coming school year is to target second graders in fifteen different schools who participate in the free and reduced lunch programs. The objective of this program is to provide dental screenings, place dental sealants, and educate parents of high-risk children about dental health in order to help prevent future disease.

Help is needed from those who have and have not yet had an opportunity to volunteer. This program is a tremendous undertaking and requires many volunteers. We again received grant monies to continue the program this year. However, when funding comes from grants, objectives must be met or the funds must be returned. We need dental professionals, staff, and community volunteers to make this a success.
