Volunteers aiding move to new museum building

Volunteers are continuing their work of getting the Chippewa Valley Historical Museum ready for its official opening in June, 1974.

Latest to become involved is the Eau Claire

Service League.

Members of the group are painting doors, oiling and refinishing furniture, cataloging, typing, indexing, sewing and repairing garments and making a new seal of Wisconsin at the

museum.
League workers have averaged about 18 hours of work per week at the museum (about 200 total hours) since September, many of them using their

own transportation to movitems from the old building to the new.

to the new.
Once completed, the
museum will be open free
of charge year round. The
12,000 square foot building
will open during "Sawdust
City Days" celebrations
next June.

To date some 307 firms and individuals have contributed over \$100,000 to the museum's completion. Slightly over \$40,000 is

needed for completion of interior development, according to museum officials.

Yet unfinished are interior ceiling and lighting, Indian dioramas, construction of historical geography and geology section and a mammal case. Items needed include maintenance equipment, educational and visual aids equipment and animal taxidermy. Funds for Smithsonian traveling exhibits rental are also being

Museum officials sai that a \$2,000 donation will assure that the donor name will be placed on permanent case of diorama. A donation of \$5 will secure the donor name on the recognition
