We began planning for the 2004 Midwest Leadership Conference we will host this fall. The Sinterklaas Markt and Younker's Community Day fundraisers, along with the most successful Packer Party to date, raised thousands to support and further our mission. This successful fundraising has enabled us to contribute funds to the following: \$300 to The Eau Claire Children's Museum, \$750 to the Family Resource Center, \$500 to the staff of The Ruth House for training materials that develop leadership skills in the area of shelter management, \$1000 to the Department of Human Services to supply funds for educational and recreational programs for Eau Claire County Foster Children, \$100 to Warm the Children, and \$200 to purchase printed materials that advertise the 'Safe Haven Law' to get the word out and prevent newborns from being abandoned.

This summer, the board will convene as a new team to plan and train for the coming year. We, as a League, will raise funds at Country Jam while enjoying the company of friends and listening to country music, and we will pack and distribute more backpacks than ever before in the history of our signature project.



ur next endowment board meeting is May 27th at 1pm at Peoples Bank. The endowment currently has a net portfolio Value as of March 31, 2004 of \$36,006.65 and the Junior League Endowment Interest Account has a value of \$6,437.49. Most recently the Endowment Trust board granted the Eau Claire

Hygienist Association with \$1,000 for the purchase of an additional chair for the Dental Sealant program. The Endowment Trustee is mailing letters to all area Dentists to challenge them to help raise the total amount needed of \$2,800 by donating additional matching funds. There have been several area dentists who have risen to the challenge and sent a check to the Sealant program!

The Junior League presents funding requests to the Endowment Trust board as they meet the definition of charitable donations and match the mission of the League. The next Endowment board meeting will address any new requests received from JLEC.

The Endowment Board is made up of the past two presidents of Junior League, the current president, the president elect and three sustainer representatives. The May 27th meeting will determine who the Endowment board is for 2004-2005.

All contributions made to the corpus (we spend the interest) are tax deductible. Consider making a contribution to build the corpus of the Endowment Trust to honor a loved one!

Get to know our newest members!



Our league has donated \$200 to purchase 500 "Safe Place for Newborns" posters that we will place Junior

League of Eau Claire Logo stickers on and distributed to area locations where women of all ages can view. The posters tell women that there is a no prosecute law for leaving newborn babies at specific loca-

tions in our area as the alternative to abandoning them or worse. These women who are in situations that they feel are hopeless will get a choice and

babies will get a chance.

When the posters arrive we will be soliciting the help of league members to display them in locations such as churches, high schools, dormitories, grocery stores, neighborhood restaurants ...any where there is a community bulletin board. What great continued support of Women and Children!
