## Corn Salsa

2 cans shoe peg corn

1 can black beans (rinsed)

Onion (green)

1 red bell pepper

1 jalapeno pepper

1/3 c. rice wine vinegar

1 T. Dijon mustard

1 T. olive oil

2/3 c. chopped fresh cilantro Tabasco, salt & pepper to taste Pinch cayenne

Mix all above. Refrigerate at least 2 hours.

### AJLI May Have Chosen You!

Association-wide Membership Research Study Underway

Membership acquisition, satisfaction and retention are critical issues today for all Junior Leagues – whether a League is growing or losing members. In an effort to better support its member Leagues, AJLI is embarking upon a major membership research study that will be fielded in late June, 2005.

Our League is asking that if you receive by mail one of the 5,000 questionnaires, which will go out to members across the Association, you take a moment to participate. Your views will truly make a difference in a project that is critical to the future of Junior Leagues everywhere.

The research will be conducted by NOP World, formerly known as Roper Starch, the major, international research firm that conducted the last Association-wide research in 1998. The questionnaires will be sent to a random sample of League members. No one at AJLI, and no one in this League, will know who was selected. Your input will be completely confidential.

The survey itself will state that it is being fielded on behalf of the Association of Junior Leagues International Inc., and that your League President is aware of the project, although does not know who was contacted.
