Excerpt from Bobbi's President's Address (May '06)

...When I stand back and reflect on our most recent past, I see tremendous growth and progress. Each year has lead to the next, setting the stage for the next Chapter. So, where are we now?

Here's what I've learned:

- Junior Leagues typically begin and then hand off a project once it's established. I believe it is the desire of this League to begin handing off the backpack project. We need to find it a new home.
- 2. We desire to find a new project to support. Remember one of the reasons we wanted the affiliation with AJLI was to form new partnerships and create solutions to existing problems.
- **3.** Our membership must continue to grow if we want to continue making an impact. Active membership now stands at 47, a far cry from the 15 we had a few years ago. Oh, and the best news, we are accepting suggestions for new membership.
- 4. Lastly, I firmly believe we must never stray very far from our vision or our mission. We ARE an organization of women committed to promoting voluntarism, developing the potential of women and improving communities through effective action and leadership of trained volunteers.
